

# Jesus Makes All Things New: 5 Markers of a Growing Christian Pastor Scott Montagne January 17, 2021

"...if anyone be in Christ, that person is a new creation: old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." 2 Corinthians 5:17

The Greek in this scripture signifies a *continuing action*!

i.e., "old things have passed away and all things are *becoming new*." Or, "the old has gone and the new has begun."

#### This morning's Big Idea:

Having an abiding relationship with Christ will continue to change us.

### **5 Markers of a Growing Christian**

#### 1. Being in Christ changes your Affections.

**1 John 2:15-17** <sup>15</sup> **Do not love this world** nor the things it offers you, for when you love the world, you do not have the love of the Father in you. <sup>16</sup> For the world offers only a craving for physical pleasure, a craving for everything we see, and pride in our achievements and possessions. These are not from the Father but are from this world.

Ask Yourself: What are those things I truly desire? Who has my heart?

#### 2. Being in Christ changes your *Attitudes*.

**Philippians 2:2-6** <sup>2</sup> Make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another, and working together with one mind and purpose. <sup>3</sup> Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. <sup>4</sup> Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too. <sup>5</sup> **Have the same** *attitude* **that Christ Jesus had.** <sup>6</sup> Though he was God, he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to. <sup>7</sup> Rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant.

Ask yourself: How is my attitude... with those I greatly disagree with? My work? My family? My outlook on life?

## 3. <u>Being in Christ changes your Appetites.</u>

Galatians 5:13-17 <sup>13</sup>You have been called to live in freedom...but don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, use your freedom to serve one another in love. <sup>14</sup> For the whole law can be summed up in this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." <sup>15</sup> But if you are always biting and devouring one another, watch out! Beware of destroying one another. <sup>16</sup> So I say, let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves. The Spirit gives us desires that are good...the opposite of what the sinful nature desires. These two forces are constantly fighting each other.

Ask Yourself: Am I regularly surrendering my carnal desires to the Lord?

## 4. <u>Being in Christ changes your Actions.</u>

James 2:14-17 <sup>14</sup> What good is it, if you say you have faith but don't show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone? <sup>15</sup> Suppose you see a brother or sister who has no food or clothing, and you say, "Have a good day; stay warm and eat well"—but then you don't give that person any food or clothing. What good does that do? <sup>17</sup> So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless. **Real faith will produce good deeds.** 

Ask yourself: Have I been actively living out my faith in tangible ways?

#### 5. Being in Christ changes your Assurances.

**1 John 5:12-13 Whoever has the Son has Life;** he who does not have the Son of God does not have the life. These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

John 1:12 To all who believe Him and accept Him, He gave the right to become children of God. Romans 8:16 The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are children of God.

Jude 1:24 Now to Him [Lord Jesus Christ] who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy.

Ask Yourself: Am I at Peace? Do I really trust Christ with my Past, Present and Future?
